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Dear Parent/Guardian,

Although I am well aware that your son or daughter is embarking on a new and independent stage of their life by coming to St Catherine's, I expect that you have a great interest in the College yourself, and I am writing to tell you about the opportunities we provide for parents to feel a welcome part of our community.

This community is a thriving one, and one that we aim to ensure provides our undergraduates and graduates with a challenging but secure environment in which to pursue both their studies and their other interests.
